As many of you know, I was given the opportunity to take a month of renewal leave this summer, during which I spent time on silent retreat in a monastery, took a pilgrimage to a place from my past, and dedicated some time to writing and making art. Being intentional about stepping out of some rhythms and habits allowed me to notice more. I noticed birds. And ants. And the coolness of the grass under the trees. I noticed the smell of the soil, and the way the warmth of the sun feels on my skin after being in air-conditioning. I noticed how it sounded like a blanket covering the earth when it finally rained, and I went out into it, barefoot, dancing and laughing, and holding my arms up like a vessel being filled, a baptismal blessing. How many times does it rain, and I completely miss the blessing, content as I am to complain instead?

The Messenge

The gift of a month of just abiding in rest and in God's goodness, at least for me, was the opportunity to notice the myriad ways that God is showing up right where we are. As we move from summer into fall, we are thinking about where we are, as St. Paul's United Methodist Church and Wesley Foundation. For decades now we have forged an identity as a people who have chosen to be here, on this particular corner on College Avenue. That decision has been founded on the truth that we are a community that is shaped by Penn State University in so many different ways. But we are not simply an extension of an academic institution: we are the church, the gathered and called people of God in this valley. As we think about our place, I wonder how we might notice God in our midst? How is God present in the 40-some thousand students who arrive on our sidewalks each fall? How is God present in the engineering department? At the arboretum? In section SD of Beaver stadium? Maybe these parts of our local context have become so usual to us that we no longer notice how God is showing up.

Beginning September 8th, we will journey together in a worship series called "College Avenue," in which we are going to be exploring some of the common ground between the Academy and the Church, and the ways in which our faith isn't something separate or in opposition to science or history or the arts. Instead, we will notice the intersections and overlaps, and the ways faith and science were never meant to be sparring partners or opposite poles of a binary, but part and parcel, together, of what it means to be fully human. If we live with that kind of holy curiosity, and a determination to keep asking questions and learning together, how might it change the way we live in relationship to the university? How might we find new ways to practice being on College Avenue? How will we be people of knowledge and wisdom, of truth and justice, of how and why?

Come and join us this September as we explore these questions and notice God right where we are, discovering new ways to be St. Paul's United Methodist Church and Wesley Foundation, on College Avenue in State College, Pennsylvania.




