"... didn't you realize that your body is a sacred place, the place of the Holy Spirit?"


-1 Corinthians 6:19, The Message

"The flesh is able to receive and sustain the very life of God." These words, from the early church theologian Irenaeus, in the poem "Capable Flesh," invite us to consider something both ordinary and profound: our bodies are holy. Simply living in them—breathing, moving, feeling—is an essential spiritual practice. Some time in the second century, Irenaeus wrote, "... even at its beginning, the humble clay received God's art."

Many of us, whether through cultural messages or personal experiences, have learned to see our bodies less as art, and more as obstacles to holiness, rather than vessels of it. We may feel that our bodies are too flawed, too weak, or too unruly to reflect the presence of God. But Paul, Irenaeus, and so many others insist otherwise: if God chose to dwell in human flesh through Jesus, then our own embodiment must also be sacred!

We usually think of spiritual practices as things we do—prayer, fasting, service, study. But what if part of our calling is simply to be—to inhabit our bodies with gratitude and

awareness? In a world that often disconnects us from ourselves, giving attention to our breath, savoring the warmth of sunlight on our skin, or even acknowledging our pain with compassion can be profound acts of faith.



Jesus did not shy away from embodiment. He touched and healed,

ate and drank, walked dusty roads, and wept openly. He showed us that to be human is not to be apart from God, but to be infused with God's life.

Will you wonder with me about what it might look like to honor our bodies as places where God dwells? Perhaps it is offering ourselves kindness rather than criticism. Perhaps it is resting when we need rest or moving in ways that bring us joy. Perhaps it is recognizing that the bodies of others—no matter how different from our own—are also sacred.

As we continue through Lent, considering "Everyday Holiness," rather than trying to transcend our bodies, maybe we can lean into them. Let us know our bodies not as barriers to holiness but as living, breathing testimonies to God's presence. After all, our flesh is indeed capable of receiving God's art and sustaining the very life of God.


