
"But In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth..."

Genesis 1:1, NRSV

This summer, we're going back to the beginning.

For 10 weeks in our worship services, we'll be exploring some of the most well-known (and often misunderstood) stories in the Bible—from Adam and Eve to Abraham and Sarah, from the ark of the flood to the tower of Babel. Our worship series, "The Gospel According to Genesis," invites us to revisit these ancient texts with fresh eyes and open hearts.

You might already know these stories—or at least think you do. Maybe you remember them from Sunday school felt boards or illustrated children's bibles. Maybe you've heard them used to explain how the world works or how human beings came to be the way we are. But this summer, we'll slow down and give closer attention. We'll



listen not just for what these stories say about us, but for what they reveal about God.

These stories are full of messy people making questionable choices. There's betrayal and blessing, wandering and wonder, fear and faith. And in the middle of it all is a God who remains heartbreakingly

committed to the human family. That's where the Gospel shows up; not by importing Jesus into every chapter, but by noticing how grace, mercy, promise, and hope are already woven through these sacred stories.

Genesis doesn't give us a harsh, vengeful "God of the Old Testament," as is sometimes assumed. It gives us a God who creates out of love. A God who keeps showing up. A God who works through complicated families and unexpected people. A God who blesses, wrestles, waits, and forgives. Sound familiar?

There's good news in these old stories. Not because they're easy, but because they're honest. And because even in the most ancient of texts, God is still speaking.

So come spend your summer in Genesis with us. You might just find yourself surprised by the Gospel.






